"When Johnny Comes Marching Home ... and Gets Arrested"

In Our Name, Restoring Justice in America, a Soldier's Heart, together with Saratoga WarHorse, Prison Action Network and the Artist All-Faith Center & Life Craft Foundation Inc., present; "When Johnny Comes Marching Home...and Gets Arrested – From Honor to Dishonor and Back Again."

Our August 2012 conference concentrated on needed reforms of the American criminal justice system. This year's event will focus primarily on the plight of the United States Armed Forces Members whose arrest and imprisonment were the result of combat related post-traumatic stress disorder.

Post-traumatic stress disorder related prosecutions of American veterans of war and military service have increased dramatically from the Vietnam War era, where the diagnosis and conditions first became significant, to the post 9-11 Iraq and Afghanistan wars. For decades, Veterans' conduct in post-war civilian life often times has resulted in violence, drug addiction, alcohol abuse, suicide and crime because of undiagnosed or untreated stress disorders. Veterans are left to fend for themselves in dealing with the immense physical and psychological damage inflicted upon them during their time of service. Vietnam veterans returned home by the thousands and were, for the most part, shunned and rejected by an American public torn by the war. More recently, a study by the Veterans Administration revealed that nearly 30% of its patients who served in Iraq and Afghanistan have PTSD due to the combat intensity of multiple deployments.

The presence of veterans in city and county jails and state prisons became widespread in the 1970s and 80s. Returning veterans, often homeless, infirm and disconnected received no special consideration for their years of military service as they were processed in the criminal justice and penal systems nor were they provided with lawyers who could adequately defend them with defenses based upon their combat related stress condition. Often, our indigent veterans were pressed into plea bargains by inexperienced court appointed attorneys, vindictive prosecutors, and indifferent judges, and were made to serve long sentences in state prisons where, once again, they received no programming, treatment or care for their service related disorder.

In the early 1980s New York State Governor Mario Cuomo authorized funding for a pilot program for the "Veterans Residential Therapeutic Program", where incarcerated veterans, assigned to a common living area, could create and administer their own educational and therapeutic treatment classes. This became a healing place for veterans and enlisted men whose lives and service resulted in the PTSD condition and encounters with the State criminal justice system.

These grave issues are among the topics that will be addressed and explained by the In Our Name/Soldier's Heart Memorial Day 2013 conference.
